Driving Under the Influence of Alcohol

On December 25, 2014 at 08:20 hours, Hilltown Police responded to the 1000 block of Hilltown Pike for a single vehicle crash. Investigation determined a vehicle driven by Victor Manuel Ordonez-Colop, 41, from the 1000 block of Rickert Road, Perkasio, PA had swerved off the roadway coming to rest in a residential front lawn. Ordonez-Colop displayed signs of alcohol impairment. Ordonez-Colop was placed under arrest and transported for a blood test which later reveal a 0.319% BAC. Ordonez-Colop was charged with Driving Under the Influence of Alcohol, and Drivers Required to be Licensed.

On February 3, 2015 at 2134 hours, Hilltown Police responded to Home Depot, 782 Rt. 113 for a suspicious vehicle. The vehicle was stopped and the driver was identified as Krista M. Weil, 23, from the 1100 block of Ridge Road, Sellersville, PA. Weil displayed indications of alcohol impairment and failed a series of field sobriety tests. Weil was placed under arrest and transported for a blood test which later revealed a 0.21% BAC. Weil was charged with Driving Under the Influence of Alcohol, and Driving While Operating Privilege is Suspended.

Bad Checks

On January 28, 2015 at 1730 hours, Hilltown Police responded to the Rite Aid Pharmacy, located at 780 Rt. 113 for retail theft and bad check investigation. A review of the security video revealed the actor concealing numerous items in her purse and another bag. The female subject also issued checks to the store which were determined to be null and void. The patron was identified as Tamara Denny, 28, from the 100 block of North Third Street, Telford, PA. Denny was charged with Misdemeanor Theft by Deception, Retail Theft, and Bad Checks.

Theft

On February 12, 2015 at 1500 hours, Hilltown Police responded to the Giant food store, 760 Rt. 113 for a theft from a vehicle. Investigation determined that a subject had taken a towing port cover from a patrons BMW vehicle. Another concerned patron observed the theft and obtained the vehicle registration of the actor. The actor was identified as Hector Fabian Gonzalez, 35, from the 200 block of East Summit Street, Telford PA. Gonzalez was interviewed where he confessed to taking the part. Gonzalez was charged with Theft By Unlawful Taking, and Receiving Stolen Property.
