INFORMATIONAL FLIER- RESIDENTIAL BURGLARIES

The Hilltown Township Police Department is seeking to inform Township residents of a series of daytime residential forced-entry burglaries. In addition, the Police Department is seeking the public's assistance in resolving these burglaries and apprehending the person(s) responsible.

There have been approximately 10 attempted or successful burglaries within the Township that are believed to have been committed by the same person(s) starting in late summer/early fall 2014. In addition, burglaries in other Bucks County municipalities and other counties are believed to be attributed to this same person(s).

The targeted houses have been located primarily along secondary roads with residences scattered along it and not within more densely populated residential developments.

In one of the burglaries, a tan mini-van was reportedly observed leaving the residence.

Most recently, on January 29, 2015, a tan or beige Honda passenger vehicle backed up to the front of a residence and a white male, 40 to 50 years of age, with an olive complexion, knocked at the front door. The resident answered the door and the subject claimed he was seeking directions to Route 611 but then left the area in the opposite direction from the provided route. Several hours later, a burglary was reported at a residence 1 mile away from that location.

Residents should be aware that burglars will often approach a house and use a ruse; asking directions, asking for a fictitious person, looking for a lost dog, etc., to determine if anyone is home before attempting to make entry in an effort to avoid conflict with the residents.

Jewelry located in the master bedroom has been the primary target and is carried off by using the victim's bedspread, pillow case or a dresser drawer.

The Police Department reminds residents to always lock your doors and to use any available security system.

The Police Department requests that residents assist them by reporting any suspicious activity around their residence or that of their neighbors immediately by calling 9-1-1. The Police also request that residents obtain a description of the person(s) and any vehicle and its registration plate number if it can be attained safely.
