Endangering Welfare of Children

On July 30, 2017 at 19:25 hours, Hilltown Police responded to the 100 block of Hampshire Drive for a check the wellbeing call. Upon Investigation, Police determined the residence was in total disarray, with numerous empty alcoholic beverage containers littering the inside of the residence, and a one year old child wearing soiled diapers. The resident, identified as Sarah Elizabeth Urso, 36, from the above address, displayed indications of alcohol impairment, and the inability to provide proper care for the child. Bucks County Children and Youth Services was contacted from the scene. Police removed the child from the residence under protective custody and placed the child with a family member. Urso was charged with Endangering Welfare of Children.

Driving Under the Influence of Alcohol and/or Controlled Substance

On July 14, 2017 at 17:10 hours, Hilltown Police responded to the area of Hilltown Pike and Route 152 for the report of an erratic driver. At approximately 17:18 hours, the vehicle fitting the description provided was located in a field in the 2700 block of Hilltown Pike. Through investigation the operator was identified as Victor Manuel Ordonez-Colop, 44, from the 1000 block of Rickert Road, Perkasie, PA. Ordonez-Colop was interviewed and displayed indications of alcohol impairment. Ordonez-Colop was placed under arrest and transported for a blood test. Ordonez-Colop was charged with Driving Under the Influence of Alcohol, Drivers Required to be Licensed, and Careless Driving.

On July 14, 2017 at 23:35 hours, Hilltown Police stopped a vehicle on Green Street in Silverdale Borough for a traffic violation. The operator was identified as Eric Michael Scott, 28, from the 800 block of Orangewood Court, Perkasie, PA. Scott displayed indications of alcohol impairment and failed a series of field sobriety tests. Scott refused a blood test. Scott was charged with Driving Under the Influence of Alcohol and Following Too Close.

On July 05, 2017 at 21:15 hours, Hilltown Police stopped a vehicle on Route 309 south of Bergey Road for a speeding violation. The operator was identified as Judith Apgar, 51, from the 100 block of Cross Creek Lane, Upper Black Eddy, PA. Apgar displayed indications of alcohol and controlled substance impairment. Apgar failed a series of field sobriety tests. Apgar was charged with Driving Under the Influence of a Controlled Substance, and Driving Vehicle at Safe Speed.

Possession of Drugs and/or Paraphernalia

On July 11, 2017 at 07:33 hours, Hilltown Police responded to Route 309 near the Fairhill Road overpass for a two vehicle traffic accident. Investigation determined that a vehicle driven by James Paul Ney, 41, from the 1300 block of Old Route 309, Sellersville, PA had impacted the rear end of a box truck while traveling northbound on Route 309. During the course of the investigation, suspected controlled substance was observed in and next to the vehicle belonging to Ney. The controlled substance was submitted for laboratory analysis. Ney was charged with Possession of Drug Paraphernalia, Operation of Vehicle Without Official Certificate of Inspection, and Following Too Close.

Theft and Related

On June 5, 2017 at 18:20 hours, Hilltown Police responded to Walmart, 1515 Bethlehem Pike, for a retail theft. Investigation determined that a male patron had concealed various retail merchandise with the intention of depriving Walmart of the value thereof. The male was identified as Jonathan R. Custer, 46, from the 700 block of Hilltown Pike, Line Lexington, PA. Custer was accompanied by a female companion who was identified as Christa Ferrante, 44, from the 2000 block of Jason Drive, Huntington Valley, PA. While displaying identification, controlled substance was observed on Ferrante. Custer was charged with Retail theft, and Ferrante was charged with Possession of Controlled Substance and Possession of Drug Paraphernalia.

On May 11, at 14:40 hours, Hilltown Police responded to the Giant Food Store, 760 Route 113 for a theft of cash. Investigation determined that an employee identified as Jennifer Ann Castellana, 47, from the 100 block of Franklin Street, Souderton, PA had taken approximately \$4,000.00 in cash currency from a register at the store and the from Giant Gas Station over the past 5-6 months. Upon being interviewed, Castellana admitted to the thefts. Castellana was charged with Felony Theft by Unlawful Taking, Theft by Deception, and Receiving Stolen Property.
