Trespassing

In January and March of 2017, Hilltown Police responded to the Giant Food Store, 760 Route 113 for two incidents of stalking and harassment of a store employee by a customer, identified as George Gelegonya, 57, from the 500 block of Keystone Drive, Sellersville, PA. As a result, Gelegonya was barred from returning to and entering the store. On April 25, 2018, Hilltown Police responded to the Giant Food Store for a trespass complaint. Gelegonya had returned and entered the store despite several written and verbal warnings from store personnel and the police. Gelegonya was charged with Defiant Trespass, and Harassment.

Theft and Related Offenses

On April 16, 2018, Hilltown police responded to Giant Food Store, 760 Route 113 for a theft. Investigation determined that a store employee, identified as Ashley Kerver, 27, from the 100 block of Maple Avenue, Sellersville, PA, had been stealing money from the cash registers while working. Kerver was interviewed and admitted taking the money. Kerver was charged with Theft By Unlawful Taking or Disposition, and Receiving Stolen Property.

False Identification to Law Enforcement

On April 30, 2018, Hilltown Police stopped a vehicle in the 1500 block of Bethlehem Pike for a traffic violation. The female driving the vehicle did not have a driver's license in her possession and provided a name and date of birth which after investigation was determined to be false. The female driver was identified as Jolene J. Valencia, 38, from the 1400 block of Needham Circle, Hatfield, PA. Valencia was charged with False Identification to Law Enforcement, and Driving While Operating Privilege is Suspended- DUI Related.

Driving Under the Influence of Alcohol and/or Controlled Substance

On April 20, 2018, Hilltown Police stopped a vehicle on Route 309 near Unionville Pike for erratic driving. The operator was identified as Jennifer Watts, 30, from the 300 block of West Broad Street, Quakertown, PA. Watts displayed indications of controlled substance impairment and failed a series of

field sobriety tests. Watts refused a blood test, and was examined by a Drug Recognition Expert who determined Watts to be under the influence of several controlled substances. Watts has been charged with Driving Under the Influence of Alcohol and Controlled Substance, Driving While Operating Privilege is Suspended, Required Financial Responsibility, and Driving on Roadways Laned for Traffic.

Possession of Controlled Substance

On March 20, 2018 at 23:09 hours, Hilltown Police stopped a vehicle on Route 309 at Route 113 for an expired registration. During the stop, Police detected controlled substance within the interior of the vehicle. The front seat passenger, identified as Zachariah McCutcheon, 27, from the 700 block of West Broad Street, Quakertown, PA, was searched, and controlled substance was seized from his person. McCutcheon was charged with Possession of Controlled Substance, and Possession of Drug Paraphernalia.
