



ORDINANCE NO. 95-3
HILLTOWN TOWNSHIP
BUCKS COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA

AN ORDINANCE RESTRICTING TRUCK AND OTHER COMMERCIAL VEHICULAR USE ON THE FULL LENGTH OF TELEGRAPH ROAD, EAST CREAMERY ROAD, WEST CREAMERY ROAD, TWINBROOK ROAD, HAYHOUSE ROAD, WELCOME HOUSE ROAD, LONGVIEW ROAD, FOREST ROAD, FRONTIER ROAD, BYPASS ROAD, FRETZ ROAD, QUARRY ROAD, AND TIFFANY DRIVE; RICKERT ROAD FROM RT. 152 TO THE BOUNDARY WITH DUBLIN BOROUGH; AND THE FULL LENGTH OF MIDDLE ROAD TO THE BOUNDARY WITH DUBLIN BOROUGH.

IT IS HEREBY ENACTED AND ORDAINED by the Township of Hilltown, Bucks County, Pennsylvania, pursuant to the Pennsylvania Motor Vehicle Code and Sections thereof relating to Townships of the Second Class, as follows:

Section 1.

It shall be unlawful for any person to drive a vehicle other than a passenger car or a motorcycle on the streets or roads identified in Section 2 hereof, provided, however, that nothing in this Section shall prohibit any person driving an emergency vehicle, a truck or other commercial vehicle making local deliveries to or pick-ups from premises located along said streets or roads. A "truck" is defined as a motor vehicle designed, used or maintained primarily for transportation of property. A pick-up type or van type vehicle with a gross weight of more than 9,000 pounds or a motor vehicle towing a trailer with a combined gross weight of more than 19,000 pounds shall be prohibited on the streets or roads identified in Section 2 hereof.

Section 2.

Section 1 shall apply to the full length of Telegraph Road, East Creamery Road, West Creamery Road, Twinbrook Road, Hayhouse Road, Welcome House Road, Longview Road, Forest Road, Frontier Road, Bypass Road, Fretz Road, Quarry Road and Tiffany Drive; and Rickert Road from Rt. 152 to the boundary with Dublin Borough; and the full length of Middle Road to the boundary with Dublin Borough.

Section 3.

The proper authorities of Hilltown Township are hereby directed to erect official traffic-control signs in conformity with the provisions of the Pennsylvania Motor Vehicle Code.

Section 4.

Any person violating the provisions of this Ordinance shall be prosecuted under the pertinent section of the Pennsylvania Motor Vehicle Code, as amended, and be subject to the fines and penalties therein set forth.
