

ORDINANCE NO. 85-3
OF THE
TOWNSHIP SUPERVISORS OF THE
TOWNSHIP OF HILLTOWN
BUCKS COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA

AN ORDINANCE RESTRICTING TRUCK AND OTHER COMMERCIAL
VEHICULAR USE OF HIGHLAND ROAD FROM ITS INTERSECTION
WITH OLD ROUTE 309 AND EXTENDING EASTWARD TO ITS
INTERSECTION WITH DIAMOND STREET.

IT IS HEREBY ENACTED AND ORDAINED by the Township of
Hilltown and by the Township of West Rockhill, both of Bucks
County, Pennsylvania, pursuant to the Pennsylvania Motor Vehicle
Code and Sections thereof relating to Townships of the Second
Class, as follows:

Section 1.

It shall be unlawful for any person to drive a vehicle
other than a passenger car or a motorcycle on the street or road
identified in Section 2 or Section 3 hereof, provided, however,
that nothing in this Section shall prohibit any person driving
an emergency vehicle, a truck or other commercial vehicle making
local deliveries to or pick-ups from premises located along said
street or road.

Section 2.

As to Hilltown Township, Section 1 shall apply to that
portion of Highland Road from its intersection with Diamond Street
and extending Westward to its intersection with the Hilltown Town-
ship-West Rockhill Township boundary line.

Section 3.

As to West Rockhill Township, Section 1 shall apply to
that portion of Highland Road from its intersection with the
Hilltown Township-West Rockhill Township boundary line and extending
Westward to its intersection of Old Route 309.

Section 4.

The proper authorities of the Township involved are
hereby directed to erected official traffic-control signs in
conformity with the provisions of the Pennsylvania Motor Vehicle
Code.

Section 5.

Any person violating the provisions of this Ordinance shall be prosecuted under the pertinent section of the Pennsylvania Motor Vehicle Code, as amended, and be subject to the fines and penalties therein set forth.
