

ORDINANCE NO. 75-1

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF HILLTOWN, BUCKS COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, HAVING ACCEPTED THE SAME FROM THE STATE OF PENNSYLVANIA, NOW VACATES AND ABANDONS A PORTION OF TOWNSHIP ROAD KNOWN AS OLD BETHLEHEM PIKE, OR LEGISLATIVE ROUTE 09088, AND THE BRIDGE STRUCTURE SITUATE THEREON, FROM A POINT DESIGNATED AS S.L.D. STA. 48+67 AT THE INTERSECTION OF FOREST ROAD, ALSO KNOWN AS T-360 TO A POINT DESIGNATED AS S.L.D. STA. 52+56 AT THE INTERSECTION OF ROUTE 113, ALSO KNOWN AS LEGISLATIVE ROUTE 270

WHEREAS, under Section 1101 of the Second Class Township Code of May 1, 1933, P.L. 103, as amended, the Board of Supervisors has the power to accept and vacate streets or parts thereof; and

WHEREAS, the following described Township Roads lie wholly within the Township of Hilltown, Bucks County, Pennsylvania; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors has specifically determined that the said road is unimproved, useless, inconvenient and burdensome, that the vacating thereof is necessary for the public convenience, and that the vacating thereof is in accordance with the spirit and intent of the Township Comprehensive Plan; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors has held a public hearing in regard to the vacating of said road, after due notice in writing having been given to the abutting property owners.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ORDAINED and ENACTED by the Board of Supervisors of Hilltown Township, Bucks County, Pennsylvania, and it is hereby ORDAINED and ENACTED by the authority of the same as follows:

Section 1. That a portion of Township Road known as Old Bethlehem Pike or Legislative Route 09088 and the bridge structure

situate thereon from a point designated as S.L.D. Sta. 48+67 at the intersection of Forest Road, also known as T-360 to a point designated as S.L.D. Sta. 52+56 at the intersection of Route 113, also known as Legislative Route 270, and as may be further described by survey on record with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, Department of Transportation. Said area containing 6,725.5 S.F. or 0.154 acres, more or less.

Section 2. That the map, zoning map, or plan of the Township of Hilltown be amended by striking therefrom the said portions as above described as having been accepted from the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and is hereby abandoned and vacated.

Section 3. That all Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall become effective five (5) days after final enactment.
