HILLTOWN TOWNSHIP BOARD OF SUPERVISORS REGULARY SCHEDULED MEETING MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 11, 2017

The regularly scheduled meeting of the Hilltown Township Board of Supervisors was called to order by Chairman John B. McIlhinney at 7:04 PM and opened with the Pledge of Allegiance. Also in attendance were Vice-Chairman Kenneth Bennington, Supervisor James Groff, Township Manager Lorraine Leslie, Township Solicitor Steve Harris, Township Engineer C. Robert Wynn, and Chief of Police Christopher Engelhart. A moment of silence was observed in remembrance of September 11, 2001.

Chairman McIlhinney stated the Police Department Sergeant Promotion will be next on the agenda. Chief Engelhart stated he is before the Board to make a request that Officer John Gildea be promoted to the rank of Sergeant. A competitive process was recently completed for the position that was vacated by the retirement of Sergeant Mahaffey. Candidates took a written and oral examination, and were also subject to a command review. Based on the results of the process, Chief Engelhart recommends to the Board the promotion of John Gildea to the rank of Sergeant. Officer Gildea has been with the department since 1996; a 21 year veteran. He was previously part time with Lower Saucon Township and Hellertown Borough Police Departments. He is currently one of only two municipal police officers trained as Drug Recognition Expert in Bucks County and is also one of the department's narcotics investigators. Officer Gildea resides in Richland Township with his wife Lisa and their daughters Tara and Erica. Motion was made by Supervisor Bennington, seconded by Supervisor Groff and carried unanimously to promote Officer John Gildea to the rank of Sergeant. There was no public comment. Magisterial District Judge, Regina Armitage, proceeded with the swearing in and gave the Oath of Office to Sergeant Gildea.
