The Supervisors were visited and entertained by ^{representative} ~~two~~ automobile club of Pottstown and approx 20 taxpayers of Hilltown Twp also Lion Club members to petition Road Board to erect traffic lights on intersection of 309-113 for the safety of the public. The supervisors later passed ^{unanimous + second} a resolution for lights. As ^{follows} it is respectfully requested that the Penna Dept of Highways grant permission Hilltown Twp through its Board of Supervisors to erect proper traffic signals at intersection of 309-113 in Hilltown Twp and said expense shall be paid by Hilltown Twp (with County aid) that visibility at said intersection is bad and purpose for this request is to promote safety to all users of said intersection. The meeting adjourned to meet the 7th of Jan 1950 with the auditors at 9 o'clock A.M.

At annual meeting of Supervisors of Hilltown on this day the Supervisors reorganized the Board for the year 1950. as follows. with all Board Members present.

Sec Treas Abram K. Gathers Per 3 Auditors Meeting.
 The auditors raised the pay for operators & Foreman from 85 to 95¢ per hr. Labourers pay was raised by the Supervisors to 75¢ per hr. for the year 1950. The auditors W. K. Street Light acct and State Fund acct. but had not decided as yet on Trap Fund Bal. after resignation of Board Mr. Clinton. The newly elected Supervisor handed in his resignation. A resolution with regards to proposed Traffic Light handed in by Town of Moyers County Conn. was duly signed and returned to Mr. Moyers. The 1950 Treas. Bond was filed with the Pres. of the Auditors Board. The mailing list of Supervisors was forwarded to Dept of Highways, Harrisburg. A copy of Traffic Light resolution was mailed to District Engineer, Dept of Highways, Ardmore and one to Bucks Co Commissioners. The sec. was also authorized to have notice published in News-Herald for inspection of Budget of Hilltown by Supervisors for 1950. To be passed on Feb 6, 1950. The Supervisors appointed S. Howard Atkinson to fill the unexpired term of Robert Clinton. resigned. A resolution was passed by the Supervisors to erect & maintain a Traffic light at intersection of R. 3 & 384 in Hilltown Twp. - and pending investigation by the State Highway Dept as to requirements no further action was taken. If State Highway Dept passes favorably, the County Commissioners agreed to give county aid to amount of 50% or better of cost of erection of said light.
