Special Meeting

8-7-78

The special meeting was called to order by the Chairman of the Board of Supervisors, Feryl Spanninger. Seated at the head table were the three supervisors, the township secretary, and Allan Offensend, consultant in Municipal Government from Broomall, Pa.

The meeting was attended by approximately 50 interested residents of Hilltown Township. Mr. Spanninger explained the reason for the meeting being held, desiring imput and questions from the people of the township on the idea of having a township manager.

In a show of hands called for by Robert Smith of Callow-hill Road, the majority by a 4 to 1 count were opposed to having a manager.

Most of the concern expressed by the citizens was the fear of increased taxes and the suggestion was made that a referendum be put on the ballot to let the citizens vote on the issue. Many felt at some time the township may need a manager, but the timing is all wrong for now.

Mr. Spanninger thanked all for coming and expressing their views and he said he will call for a vote on the issue within one or two months after the supervisors have had a chance to discuss the matter further. However, the public will be given ample notice of the scheduled vote.
