

Minutes
Hilltown Township Supervisors Meeting
April 15, 1974

The meeting was called to order by the Chairman, Paul Frankenfield, who introduced all official personnel present.

A motion was made by Paul Frankenfield to approve the minutes of the last meeting and to accept the treasurer's report, seconded by Dale Hartshorne.

Feryl Spanninger recommended buying a \$10,000 treasury bill from the Federal Revenue Sharing Fund. Bills as presented were approved for payment.

Notice made of the following meetings- Thursday, April 18th, Seidel Water Co. with North Penn Water Authority to be present and Monday, April 22nd, Continuation of the H. & K. hearing.

It was reported that the Junior Chamber of Commerce found a new location for their Easter Egg Hunt.

As no requests for garden plots had been received, a tentative cut-off date of April 24th was set for receiving same.

A letter from the Grandview Hospital Auxiliary was read requesting volunteer help in setting up booths, etc at the annual Lawn Fete. It was decided this was not a township project.

A letter from Mr. Wilson to the supervisors re: Penn Dot placing of signs on State Roads. 1. No sign will be placed on a state road without approval by the District office. 2. Sign must be approved and be of the type with the message approved by the Secretary of Transportation. 3. Signing requests can be made by anyone for authorized and approved signs. "Watch Children" signs not supplied by the state. A request for this type of sign can be submitted to the supervisors of the township and if the supervisors agree this type of sign is necessary, they can try to get approval for erecting these signs.

Forms were received from the state relative to our application for a federal grant under PL92-500. These forms were sent to our engineer for completion. We are now 49th on the list.

A letter from Francis Grabowski re: the Horn Quarry was read. Decision on this case from the Penna. Commonwealth Court should be received within the next two or three months.

Letters from R. Kirkland McQuiddy to Charles Wilson and from Charles Wilson to R. Kirkland McQuiddy re: Francis A. Gramlich, Inc. were read. A formal interpretation of the zoning laws in this area are needed.

It was reported that the blinking light at the Margaret Seyler School is working on Saturdays and Sundays. Mrs. Gutekunst will all Armour Electric to have this corrected.

It was noted that advertisements are in the papers for bids on a new dump truck.

Ray Kopp of Quarry Road and Route 313 inquired as to what decision had been reached on the truck storage or machine shop at the Francis Gramlich, Inc. property.

Motion to adjourn was made by Paul Frankenfield and seconded by Dale Hartshorne.
