

MINUTES

The meeting of the Hilltown Township Supervisors was held this 18th day of August 1973. The meeting was called to order at 9 o'clock a.m. by Chairman Mr. Frankenfield, with all supervisors present.

The meeting opened with the reading of the minutes of August 2, 1973. A motion was made by Mr. Hartshorne to accept the minutes as read, motion seconded by Mr. Frankenfield.

The bills were reviewed and ordered paid on a motion by Mr. Hartshorne, motion seconded by Mr. Frankenfield.

An agreement was signed by Mr. Hartshorne for use of a filing cabinet, property of Hilltown Township.

A contract was signed with Leon T. Armour, LTA, Armour Electric, 2015 Bath Road, Bristol, Pa., for the erection of flashing lights at the Margaret Seylar School.

The Hilltown Township Supervisors filed notice of interest in applying for Federal Disaster Assistance through the State Council of Civil Defense for damage to roads, bridges and culverts and stream channels, estimated amount of \$9,169.00 for road, 2800.00 for stream clearance.

The Supervisors signed Ordinance No. 73-7, this 18th day of Aug. 1973, designating a Speed Limit of 35 mph on Middle Road #415, from Dublin Boro Line to Broad St., #415.

A letter was read dated August 15, 1973, from the law offices of Smith and Wilson by Victor Jaczun Esquire to the Honorable Herbert A. Fogel, Room 3036 Federal Court House, re: Mager vs Moyer, Civil Action #72-2422, memorandum of law in support of motion to dismiss complaint five cases all stemming from zoning violation:

1. Township vs Mager term 1968, No.868
2. Township vs Mager, ~~###~~, term 1970 No. 3203
3. Township vs Mager, ~~###~~, term 1970 No. 3202
4. Township vs Mager, #1592, March term 1970
5. Mager vs Supervisors, zoning officer, No.2150, March term 1971

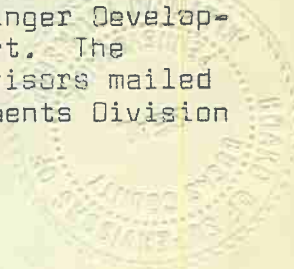
In addition we received opinion of the Chancellor, Township of Hilltown vs Mager in Exhibit "A" Equity A1, Equity Opinion Order of Court Exhibit "B" B-1, B-2, Exhibit C, Exhibit "D" E-1, E-2, E-3, E-4, #-5, Exhibit "E" D-1, D-2, D-3, D-4, #-5 D-6 and D-7.

The Supervisors approved the budget for Federal Revenue Sharing Funds, beginning July 1, 1973, to June 30, 1974.

A letter was read dated August 8, 1973 from R. C. Cowan Associates, a survey of sanitary sewerage system needs and waste water treatment facilities to sign booklets and forward to the Dept. of Environmental Resources.

A letter was read dated August 13, 1973, from Wm. G. Major Associates Inc., engineer for Joel Benner Development to R. S. Cowan Assoc. Inc. stating that they were forwarding final drawings to them for review and recommendation.

A letter was received dated July 31, 1973, from 1875 New Hope St., Charles Rehn, Chief Planning Section on the Michael Singer Development, acknowledging receipt of their preliminary report. The Supervisors received a copy of the letter. The Supervisors mailed report of tax revenues to the Bureau of Census Governments Division Washington, D. C. Aug. 17, 1973.



The July Police report was read.

A letter was read dated August 6, 1973, from the North Penn Water Authority to the Supervisors, regarding the drilling of test wells along the Phila. Electric right of way, that they drilled one to a depth of 415 ft., and wanted to drill two others and would seek the approval of the Delaware River Basin Commission, the Dept. of Environmental Resources and the Bucks County Health Dept.; also any resident having cloudy water is to contact them on any water problems.

A notice from the zoning hearing Board to the Supervisors of the rescheduling of the William T. Poust hearing for a variance.

Bids were opened for a tractor and mower and a new police car.

The tractor-mower bid from Paul W. Hestand Co., in the amount of \$5,218, contract awarded to them on a motion by Mr. Frankenfield and seconded by Mr. Hartshorne.

The police car bid was received from Liverman Chev. Inc., amount of \$3,919.00; contract awarded to Liverman Chevrolet Inc. on a motion by Mr. Frankenfield and seconded by Mr. Hartshorne.

Mr. Renz, a resident of Hilltown, stated that he did not think the home for girls was a suitable location.

Mr. Keller requested the Supervisors to inform the Bucks County Health Dept. that they are opposed to their stringent requirement for site sewage disposal.

A Resolution requested by the Bucks County Health under Act 537, for on site disposal tabled.

There being no further business, a motion for adjournment was made by Mr. Frankenfield, motion seconded by Mr. Moyer; the meeting adjourned at 11:45 a.m.

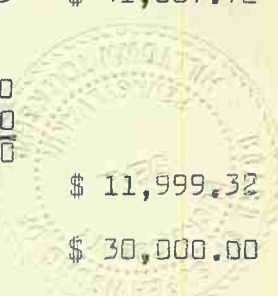
