

MINUTES

The meeting of the Hilltown Township Board of Supervisors met this 5th day of April at the Municipal Building located at 113 State St., Blooming Glen, Pa.

The meeting was called to order by the Chairman, Mr. Frankenfield, at 7:30 P.M., with all Supervisors present, and our Solicitor.

The meeting opened with the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting held on March 24, 1973. On a motion by Mr. Hartshorne, it was moved to accept the minutes as read, but he objected to the Treasurer's Report. A motion was made by Mr. Frankenfield to accept the minutes and treasurer's report as read, the motion was seconded by Mr. Moyer.

A motion was made to pay all bills, by Mr. Hartshorne and seconded by Mr. Frankenfield. When the bills are approved for payment, it is the duty of the treasurer to pay them.

Mr. Hartshorne objected to the use of Revenue Sharing Funds to pay for Engineering Service and Stop Signs, as an improper use. When Mr. Moyer asked him to prove it was an improper use, there was no answer. The Guidelines thus far allows for payments for Health and Safety and other priority expenditures. He also asserted the money was improperly spent. Mr. Frankenfield stated the money was handled securely.

A letter dated April 3, 1973, from the law firm of Souder & Rosenberger, requested information as to the requirement of subdivision approval on ten acres or more. This was referred to our solicitor for answering; they also requested a copy of the Sub-division Ordinance.

A copy of a letter was read from the law offices of Smith & Wilson, to Kenneth Reems, 84 Gough St., Ivyland, Pa., inquiring if he was going to remove the fence that he had placed on a recorded Right of Way.

The Supervisors signed a contract with the Farm & Home Oil Co. for Township gasoline, and oil requirements for the year 1973.

A notice was read that the Zoning Hearing Board will hold a meeting, Monday, April 9, 1973, The appeals are as follows for requests for variances or special acceptions from the Hilltown Township Zoning Ordinance:

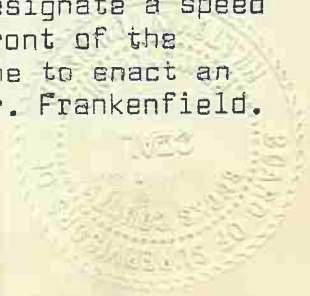

The Supervisors agreed to reconstruct Longview Rd., .5 mile and Frontier Rd., .5 mile.

We received from the Pa. Liquor Control Board, receipts for liquor licenses for 1973, in the amount of \$1400.

A motion was made by Mr. Hartshorne to have the Secretary write a letter to Assemblyman Marvin D. Weidner, requesting the Supervisors urge him to use his influence to have the Covered Bridge on Blooming Glen Road, near Fifth St., repaired; the motion was seconded by Mr. Frankenfield.

A letter was read from Mrs. Mildred Robbins, of Our Lady of the Sacred Heart Parish, requesting the Supervisors to designate a speed zone area of 15 miles per hour along Broad St., in front of the Parochial School. A motion was made by Mr. Hartshorne to enact an Ordinance for the speed zone area, and seconded by Mr. Frankenfield.



A Resolution was introduced by Mr. Hartshorne:

"Be it resolved by the Board of Supervisors of Hilltown Township hereby agree to place into an Escrow Account, the sum of Thirty-thousand (30,000) dollars, received as Federal Revenue Sharing money, for the purchase of open land in Hilltown Township, to be used for Recreational purposes by present and future generations."

So Resolved this 5th day of April 1973.

A letter was read from Econolite Inc., 1050 George St., York, Pa., dated March 23, 1973, stating that it had come to their attention that Hilltown Township was interested in installing Flashing Warning Devices, and that they had materials on hand and could also contract with firms who could erect them.

Mr. Eugene Parzyck, 119 N. Main St., Trumbauersville, Pa., requested a letter from the Township of approval to present to the Bucks County Department of Health for installation of Holding Tank located at Swartley Road and Route 309.

Mr. Wilson stated he was working on the Holding Tank Ordinance.

Mrs. Swartz, a resident of Middle Road, wanted to know how many dogs constituted a Dog Kennel; she also stated dogs were killing their rabbits. Our Solicitor, Mr. Wilson will contact the proper authorities, if they have licenses.

Mr. Fray asked a question what could be done about dogs on his property. Mr. Wilson was advised to check.

Mr. Pilarski presented the Board of Supervisors a list of names adjacent to the Fretz Tract, who are in opposition to the Rezoning.

The Supervisors signed the final Subdivision plans, 1 lot, for Anthony Dembrosky; Preliminary Subdivision Plans for Joseph Hirsch, Broad St., and for Lydia Alexander, Blueschool Rd.

Mr. Glick requested clarification of notation on Subdivision Plan and why road improvements were required.

A motion was made by Mr. Hartshorne that we donate \$200 to the Bucks County S. P. C. A., motion seconded by Mr. Frankenfield.

Mr. Marx, Hilltown Pike, had a question in reference to a water condition on his property.

A motion was made for adjournment by Mr. Hartshorne and seconded by Mr. Frankenfield. The meeting adjourned at 9:45 P.M.
