MINUTES

The meeting of the Hilltown Township Supervisors was held this lst day of February, 1973, at the Municipal Building, Blooming Glen, Pa.

The meeting was called to order by the Chairman, Mr. Franken-field, at 7:30 P.M. Present were Mr. Frankenfield and Mr. Moyer.

Mr. Hartshorne could not be present.

Others present were Mrs. Mohr, Mr. Heidrich, Mr. Gubelman, Mr. & Mrs. Cameron, Mr. Reep, Mr. Mininger, Mr. Daub, Mr. Toth, Mr. Kopp, Mr. Gilmore, Mr. Schultz, and reporters, Mr. Cressman, Call-Chronicle, and Mr. Mitchell of the North Penn Reporter.

The meeting opened with the reading of the minutes of the January 20, 1973, meeting; a motion was made by Mr. Frankenfield to approve the minutes as read, and was seconded by Mr. Moyer.

The bills were reviewed and ordered paid on a motion by Mr. Frankenfield, and seconded by Mr. Moyer.

A Fire Report was read, dated January 30, 1973, from the Silverdale Fire Co., stating there were twenty (20) calls to Hilltown.

A letter was read, dated January 30, 1973 from the Board of Assessment & Appeals, in reference to a copy of the new coding that will appear in the 1973 tax duplicate.

Mention was made by the Secretary, that Mr. Beechwood, director of Environmental Resources contacted the office by phone to invite us to a meeting at the Bucks County Dept. of Health, Neshaminy Manor, March 1, 1973, at 7:30 P.M., notices will be mailed.

We received a dividend check in the amount of \$12 for stock held by Hilltown Township.

A letter dated January 22, 1973, was read, from the Delaware Valley Regional Planning Commission, Philadelphia, Pa., that Chalfont-New Britain Sewerage is being considered for Funding and if we had any comments for or against it.

The Supervisors signed a resolution for a Pension Plan for Employee's at a cost of \$5,000 a year for ten years and then a cost of \$3,000 a year thereafter, effective date, January 1, 1973. Membership for each employee otherwise eligible, will take effect on the first day of January immediately following his original date of fulltime employment. Employee contribution is none, and excluded are future employees over the age of fifty-five, (55).

A letter was read from the Dept. of Transportation, dated

January 16, 1973, File #1797, acknowledging receipts of applications
together with condition diagrams for permission to erect and maintain
traffic signals at these locations:

Dublin Pike, L. R. 270, Route 313, and Broad St. Blooming Glen Rd., L. R. 771 & L. R. 9088, Hayhouse Rd.

Callowhill Rd., L. R. 09078 & Route 113, L. R. 170.

A letter was read from our Solicitor, dated Jan. 22, 1973, in which Victor Jaczun stated a petition was enclosed to schedule a hearing to show casue why Mr. Mager should not be held in contempt. The Secretary was to sign and forward the affidavit to Mr. Jaczun.

A letter was read from our Solicitor, dated Jan. 29, 1973, that they had received copies of construction costs for the Perkasie Sewer Authority Treatment Plant and they forwarded copies to our Engineer and to Bond Counsel.

The Supervisors signed agreement for Engineering Services, so that our Engineer could forward application to the Home Administration for the Funding of the Sewer lines.

Mr. Gubelman raised the question, if seventy-five percent of the property owners were against the Sewer line, the Supervisors could not proceed? Our Solicitor's answer was, that he was not sure if this was so.

We signed a three lot Subdivision Plan for Leonard Sterling, located on Route 389 and 113.

There being no further business, Mr. Frankenfield made a motion to adjourn, which was seconded by Mr. Moyer. The meeting adjourned at 9:30 P.M.
