

MINUTES

The meeting of the Hilltown Township Supervisors was held Dec. 16, 1972, at the Municipal Building, at Blooming Glen, Pa.

The meeting was called to order at 9:00 A.M. by the Chairman, Mr. Frankenfield, with all Supervisors present.

The Chairman requested the minutes be read of the previous meeting held Thursday, Dec. 7, 1972.

A motion was made by Mr. Hartshorne to accept the minutes as read, and was seconded by Mr. Frankenfield.

The bills were reviewed and ordered paid on a motion by Mr. Hartshorne, and seconded by Mr. Frankenfield.

We received from Titus G. Moyer, \$514.35 Per Capita Tax, and Prior year tax from the County, \$1.68.

A letter was read from our Solicitor, to consider reducing the density units in a Multi-Family area. We will consider this at our January meeting, 1973.

Mr. Hartshorne, the Supervisor's representative on the Advisory Board of Today Inc., informed us that the residents of the home have been moved to the home in Newtown, and this home in Hilltown will be used as a Half-Way House. He also stated there was a need for a vacuum cleaner and an automobile. The drive way needs attention, and Mr. Frankenfield will check and see what is needed to improve the drive-way.

The Supervisors wish to thank the Deep Run Jaycees for the nice painting job that they did in the gym building.


