A letter was read from the office of the County Commissioners, that nominations for various offices to be filled in the district for the primary election to be held Tues. May 15, 1973, are to be filed on the form provided and forwarded to them by Feb. 16, 1973.

The Supervisors signed Resolution 72-14, transferring funds from the following accounts, to the Highway Maintenance account #4.10:

The Supervisors adopted Ordinance #72-2, relating to Sanitation and Disposal of Refuse produced in Hilltown Township;

Ordinance #72-3 modifying and amending certain portions of the basic BOCA Code, and repealing Ordinance #68-2 which had adopted the BOCA abridged Building Code Fourth Edition 1965.

Ordinance #72-4, an ordinance regulating and restricting the speed of motor vehicles on Central Ave., between County Line Rd. and a point 1500 ft. eastwardly thereof, and regulating parking on Central Ave. at the same point.

A letter was read from the Dept. of Transportation, 200 Radnor-Chester Road, St. David's, Pa., stating that our letter of Nov. 6, 1972 concerning the safety of school children in front of the Margaret Seylar School had been considered and that they will install two "School" signs within the immediate future. Also, after investigation, if solution of the problem warrants, flashing signs will be installed, of 15 m/p/h, to be in operation three periods a day, five days a week, not to exceed three hours each day.

Applications were received for traffic lights at Route 313 and Broad St., L. R. Route 09078 and Pa. Route 113, and L. R. Route 09088 and L. R. Appl. 771, with a request for a plan of the intersections extending 150 ft. on each approach to be present to the Dept.

The budget for Hilltown Township for the year 1973 was read, the amount of the proposed tentative budget was \$324,917.95, with the millage set at .005 mills.

Many residents protested and thought the millage should have been reduced two mills. Many protested that our appropriation for Wage taxes should be increased, thereby lessening the millage rate for Real Estate.

Mr. Hartshorne protested and agreed with them that the budget should be reduced and millage lowered. Many questions were asked and answered, especially in reference to the appropriations for Fire Co. and the Secretary's salary increase. The budget is to be adopted Friday ~~XXXXXXXX~~ December 29, 1972.

There being no further business, a motion was entertained to adjourn, by Mr. Hartshorne and seconded by Mr. Frankenfield, motion carried.
