

MINUTES

A meeting was held by the Hilltown Township Supervisors, on this 18th day of November, 1972, at the Municipal Building, located in Blooming Glen, Pa.

The meeting was called order by the Chairman, Mr. Frankenfield, with all the Supervisors present.

The meeting opened with the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting held November 2, 1972. The minutes were accepted as read on a motion by Mr. Hartshorne, which was seconded by Mr. Frankenfield.

The bills were reviewed by the Supervisors and ordered paid, on a motion by Mr. Hartshorne and seconded by Mr. Frankenfield.

Present were Mr. Heidrich, Mr. Gubelman, Mr. Boose, Mr. Keller and reporters, Lorraine Campbell, Intelligencer, Bonnie Mostella, Free Press, Mr. Cressman, Call-Chronicle, and Mr. Mitchell, of the North Penn Reporter.

Receipts from the tax collector, Titus G. Moyer, totaled \$3,241.59, \$518.79 for Real Estate Tax and \$ 2,722.80, Per Capita.

A motion was presented by Mr. Frankenfield that we make a charge for submitting a subdivision plan. We have not set a definite fee schedule.

A letter was read from Dr. William E. Keim, superintendent of the Pennridge School District, resepectfully requesting the Supervisors to contact them if we are approached for permission for a franchise to construct a cable television through Hilltown Township. The Supervisors favor the request.

A letter was read from our Solicitor, Smith and Wilson, in reference to "Hilltown vs Mager", stating that the Mager allôcatur from the decision of the Commonwealth Court in matters concerning injunctions for violation of the Zoning and Building Ordinances has been denied.

A contempt citation can be issued if the building is presently occupied.

A letter was received from our Solicitor stating that he has prepared an ordinance adopting the Basic Building Code 1970 with all Supplements and has sent it out for advertising.

The fee schedule we are using is as follows:

Residence	\$13.00 per square foot
Commercial	\$11.00 per square foot
Industrial	\$ 9.00 per square foot
Ware house	\$ 8.00 per square foot

A letter was read from Eastburn and Gray if we would consider the fact to have developers construct sewer lines and dedicate them to the township.

A letter was read from the Penna. State Supervisors Assoc. on Federal Revenue Sharing; we can expect a check in December 1972 and one January 1973. A report each quarter must show what the money was expended for. We are not to budget this money until it has been received.

The police report was read.

A petition to the Supervisors containing 70 names with a request to have a traffic light on Route 313 and Broad St. was presented to the Supervisors. Mr. Kenneth Gross requested

Mr. Hartshorne, representing the Supervisors, on the Advisory Committee of Today Inc., mentioned that they were having a float in the Lansdale Christmas Parade held Nov. 18, 1972.

There being no further business, Mr. Frankenfield entertained a motion to adjourn, a motion was made by Mr. Hartshorne and seconded by Mr. Frankenfield. The meeting adjourned at 11 o'clock a.m.
