

## MINUTES

The meeting of the Hilltown Township Supervisors was held November 2, 1972, at the Municipal Building, located on State St., Blooming Glen, Pa.

The meeting was called to order by the Chairman, Mr. Frankenfield, with all Supervisors present, at 7:30 P.M.

The meeting opened with the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting held October 21, 1972.

A motion was made by Mr. Hartshorne to accept the minutes as read, and the motion was seconded by Mr. Frankenfield.

A letter was read from the Bucks County Commissioners, inviting the Supervisors to a meeting to be held in the Jury Lounge, on the construction and operation of a transfer station for Solid Refuse, to be located on Neshaminy Manor, Route 611, near Edison.

Mr. Hartshorne inquired if the dependents of our full time police could be covered under our police pension fund insurance. The Secretary will consult with Mr. Mackowski, our police pension fund agent.

A copy of a letter was read from representative Marvin Weidner, to the Department of Transportation, Mr. Joseph Synkonis, Jr., District Engineer, stating that Bedminster and Hilltown Township are requesting permission to erect and maintain a traffic light at Routes 313 and 113.

Mrs. Edith Agin presented a flag to the Board of Supervisors, in memory of Mr. Agin, a former Supervisor and Secretary of Hilltown Township. The Chairman of the Board, Mr. Frankenfield, accepted the flag on behalf of the Board of Supervisors, and expressed our thanks to Mrs. Agin.

The Supervisors signed Resolution #72-13, the revised form for the Penridge regional recreation and open space planning council.

Mr. Poole, finance chairman, of the Chalfont Volunteer Fire Co. presented a fair share assistance plan for the fire company; the Supervisors reviewed the report favorably.

Mr. Mill, a resident of the village of Blooming Glen, presented a petition to the Board of Supervisors, calling their attention to the dangerous curve on Route 113 at the southwest end of Blooming Glen.

The secretary is to forward the request to the Department of Transportation.

We were notified by our engineering firm that engineering costs would be higher for 1973.

Members of the Deep Run Jaycees, Mr. Reading, Mr. Stutzman, and Mr. Mild, offered to paint the inside of the gym building if the Supervisors would supply the paint. The Supervisors agreed to furnish it.

Mr. Browning showed the Supervisors a proposed subdivision plan and wanted to know what would be required for approval. After some discussion, it was suggested that the bank on Pheasant Hill Road would have to be cut back.

There being no further business, on a motion by Mr. Hartshorne, which was seconded by Mr. Frankenfield, the meeting adjourned at 10:08 P.M.
