Minutes

The meeting of the Hilltown Township Supervisors was held this October 5, 1972, at the Township Building, located on Route 113, and Diamond St.

The meeting was called to order by the Chairman at 7:30 P.M., with Mr. Frankenfield and Mr. Moyer present. Mr. Hartshorne could not be present, asinhe was on jury duty.

Chairman Frankenfield requested the Secretary to read the minutes of the previous meeting held September 16, 1972. A motion was made by Mr. Frankenfield to accept themminutes as read, and seconded by Mr. Moyer.

The bills were reviewed and ordered paid, on a motion by Mr. Frankenfield, seconded by Mr. Moyer.

Those present were Mr. Gubelman, Mr. Heidrich, Mr. Glace, Mr. Mininger, Mr. Caltabiand, Chief Boose and Reporters, Florence Schaffhausen, Intelligencer, Bonnie Mostella, Free Press, Mr. Cressman, Call-Chronicle, and Mr. Mitchell, North Penn Reporter.

The Supervisors signed the preliminary subdivision plan for Joseph Polachech, SevenCorner Rd., 1 lot, 3.335 A. and the final subdivision plan for John T. Caltabiand, Route 152, 9 lots, 16.21A.

A letter was read from the Bucks County Planning Commission, Division of Natural Resources, John T. Carson, Director, notifying the Supervisors of a meeting to be held in the Community Room, Bucks County Courthouse, at 8:00 P.M., to discuss developing the Bucks County Well, located in the western area of Hilltown Township.

Received was a copy of a letter from our engineer, to the Perkasie Postmaster, with copies of house number sheets for the following roads, Hayhouse, Fretz, Longview, Bypass and Chalfont Roads.

A letter was read from the Warren Royer Post, Number 234, Vincent Citrullo, Adjutant, asking if we would consider erecting signs along Central Avenue at the Romanski Recreational Field.

A motion was made by Mr. Frankenfield stating that we enact an ordinance prohibiting no parking and a speed limit of 25 m.p.h. for this area of Central Ave.; the motion was seconded by Mr. Moyer.

We signed the application for the road opening for the North Penn Water Authority, Hilltop Manor development.

A letter was read from the Bucks County Consumer Protection Agency Betsy Miketta, Manager, recommending that the township consider adopting an ordinance regulating Self-Service Gasoline Stations. The Secretary is to refer this to our Solicitor for an opinion.

The Secretary requested permission to transfer funds from the Police Pension Savings and Bonus Bucks Accounts to the Police Pension Checking Account and to purchase a \$5,000 Savings Certificate for the Police Pension Fund.

A letter of thanks was received from Mrs. Barbara Rufe, Chairman of the Gallery in the Park, for the use of snow fence used in their display in Sellersville.

A letter was read from the Dept. of Housing and Urban Development stating that Hilltown Township is eligible for Flood Insurance. The National Flood Association has designated the General Accidents F & L Assurance, LTD, 14 Walnut St., Philadelphia, Pa. 18106, as the servicing company for Hilltown Township.

We received from R. S. Cowan Associates, the township engineer, the costs for the proposed extension beyond the village of Blooming Glen, of the sewer lines:

Mrs. Mary Wagner read a letter she received from the Dept. of Transportation, that if no agreement is reached with the Supervisors by Nov. 1, 1972, the Morris Run Bridge would be removed.

Mrs. Wagner requested the Supervisors to reconsider and approve their agreement; their agreement does not meet with the recommendation of our attorney, who advised us not to sign the agreement.

Mrs. Wagner asked the Supervisors if we would accept \$4,000 for Escrow; this offer is not acceptable. Mr. Frankenfield stated that he would not sign any agreement.

There being no further business, on a motion by Mr. Frankenfield to adjourn, and seconded by Mr. Moyer, the meeting adjourned at 10:30 P.M.
