MINUTES

The meeting of the Hilltown Township Supervisors was held this September 16, 1972, at the Township Building, Route 113 and Diamond St.

The meeting was called to order by the Chairman, Mr. Frankenfield at 9:00 A.M., with all Supervisors present.

The Chairman opened the meeting with the request that the minutes of the previous meeting be read. A motion was made by Mr. Hartshorne to accept the minutes as read; the motion was seconded by Mr. Frankenfield.

The bills were reviewed by the Supervisors and ordered paid on a motion by Mr. Hartshorne, seconded by Mr. Frankenfield.

Present were Mr. Gubelman, Miss Suzanne Hartshorne, Chief Boose, and reporters, Lorraine Campbell, Intelligencer, Mr. Cressman, Call-Chronicle, and Mr. Mitchell, of the North Penn Reporter.

A letter was read from the Bucks County Planning Commission, calling attention to the changes in Act. 247 with amendment of Act 95 effective 1972.

Received from Titus Moyer, \$9,118.90 per capita tax, and real estate tax the amount of \$413.90; receipts from Edw. Mininger, for building and zoning permits, \$1,425.50.

The Supervisors received a deed and mortgage release from Vincent and Kathleen Pischl to the Township of Hilltown, dated July 27,1972, recorded in deedbook No. 2045, Page 82, which conveys 8,304 sq. ft. of land situateiin Hilltown Township, Bucks County.

A letter was read from Florence Ziemons, stating her intentions to purchase a property located on Route 313, south of the borough of Dublin, as a residential professional dwelling, to conduct a business as a beautician.

She requested a letter from the Supervisors, in order to secure a permit from the Dept. of Labor and Industry, that she would not be violating the township zoning ordinance. After some discussion the Secretary was to get a ruling from our solicitor. Mr. Frankenfield remarked that Rpute 313 should be zoned Highway Commercial.

There being no further business, Mr. Frankenfield entertained a motion to adjourn; Mr. Hartshorne made a motion to adjourn, motion seconded by Mr. Frankenfield. The meeting adjourned at 10:00 A.M.
