

MINUTES

June 17, 1972

The meeting of the Hilltown Township Supervisors was held June 17, 1972, at the Township Building, Route 113 and Diamond St., Silverdale, Pa.

The meeting was called to order at 9:00 A.M. by the Chairman, with all the Supervisors present. The Chairman requested the Secretary to read the minutes of the previous meeting, held June 1, 1972. A motion by Mr. Hartshorne to accept the minutes as read, was presented and seconded by Mr. Frankenfield.

On a motion by Mr. Hartshorne, seconded by Mr. Frankenfield, it was agreed to pay all bills.

Present were Mr. Hockman, Mr. Browning, Mr. Gubelman, Mr. Finkelstein, Mr. Sugarman, Mrs. Grim, Mr. Weikel, Mr. & Mrs. Freil, Mr. & Mrs. Parker, and reporters, Lorraine Campbell of the Intelligencer, Mr. Cressman of the Call Chronicle, Vivian Paul of the Free Press and Mr. Mitchell of the North Penn Reporter.

Mr. Frankenfield reported that he received a phone call from the Supervising Principal of the Pennridge School District, Mr. Keim, that informed him they would vacate the High School Building at Blooming Glen by August 15, 1972.

We signed a contract for fire protection with the Telford Fire Co. and the amount they will receive is \$1,000. The Souderton Fire Co. returned their contract, unsigned, with no explanation.

The supervisors signed a resolution, Act 72, authorizing pooled pledges by depository for the Bucks County Bank and Trust Co.

A proposed resolution by the Supervisors was read:

"Be it resolved, by the Board of Supervisors of Hilltown Township, that we respectfully request the Pennsylvania Power and Light Co. of 901 Hamilton St., Allentown, Pa. if it be possible to have the 66 KV Cable line be placed underground, through Hilltown Township, so as to preserve the natural beauty of this area for future posterity."

Mr. Finkelstein stated that he would like to have in the resolution, that if there was a need for the line, that it be placed underground. Mr. Sugarman, attorney for Mr. Finkelstein, stated that the 66 KV line will be made into 138 volt line, and stated that the P. P. & L. Co. would not supply any additional information to East Rockhill Township. He also stated a need should be shown by the P. P. & L. Co., and that the line should be underground.

After changes and additions, a stronger resolution was read, #72-6,

"In view of the fact that the Pennsylvania Power and Light Company of 901 Hamilton Street, Allentown, Pa., has failed to satisfactorily prove the need for the proposed high voltage electric power transmission line through the north westerly portion of Hilltown Township, the Board of Supervisors of Hilltown Township, by this resolution, hereby, (1) request that such line not be constructed and (2) if in the future, need for such facility is verified, that all lines be placed underground to preserve the natural beauty of this area."

So resolved this 17th day of June 1972, HILLTOWN TOWNSHIP SUPERVISORS, Hilltown Township.

Mr. & Mrs. Freil, and Mr. & Mrs. Parker, residents of Hillcrest Road, requested of the Board of Supervisors, if a speed limit could be set for Hillcrest Road, as there were numerous speeders using this road. After some discussion, a motion by Mr. Frankenfield was made to erect "Drive Slow" signs at each end of Hillcrest Road; the motion was seconded by Mr. Moyer. They are also to notify the police if there are speeders,

Application of the Pennsylvania Power and Light Company under Act of the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, approved May 5, 1933, P. L. 364, as amended, for a finding and determination that service to be furnished by applicant through its proposed exercise of the power of eminent domain to acquire right of way for the construction operation and maintenance of electric lines and related facilities over and across land of H. Calvin and Doris L. Weikel, Justis O. and Mary M. Moyer, in Hilltown Township, Bucks County, is necessary for proper for the service, accomodation, convenience or safety of the public. Hearings to be held July 24, 1972, at 10:00 A.M. in the courthouse, Doylestown, Pa.

Also hearing will be held for Herman and Elizabeth Finkelstein, Arthur E. and Maria J. Ketterer, July 25, 1972, at 10:00 A.M. and on July 26, 1972, hearings for Wilmer K and Romaine L. Zeigler, and A. Roscoe Moyer and Nina F. Moyer.

We received from the Bucks County Legal Aid Society, Lorry Post, attorney and director, copies of newspaper reports on method for suburbs to aid the poor.

A notice from the Department of Transportation of the proposed construction of L. R. 09088, section 11S.

A letter was read from Kenneth R. Smith, Director of Athletics, Pennridge High School, to participate in exploring the possibility for receiving funds for a regional recreational program.

Mr. Porter, Chairman of the West Rockhill and Sellersville joint recreational authority presented the Board of Supervisors with a letter from Manning H. Mosely III, Department of Community Affairs, Regional Recreation and Park Advisors, and would meet with the Group to discuss a park and recreation organization. The Supervisors will meet with the surrounding municipalities July 18, 1972, at the Pennridge Junior High School at 8:00 P.M.

The secretary is to inform our Solicitor to advertize an ordinance regulating the changes, grading altering of property land levels, natural or artificial contained water levels thereon.

Mr. Charles Keller, commended the Supervisors for their road inspection and also stated that he felt the Hilltown Township Supervisors should have a voice on the Perkasio Water and Sewer Authority.

Mr. Hartshorne gave a report, as a Supervisor member on the Advisory Committee of Today Inc. Drug Rehabilitation Center, they expect to expand the advisory board to 12 members.

The police pension fund audit was approved by the office of the Auditor General for the year ending December 31, 1971.

There being no further business, a motion by Mr. Hartshorne to adjourn was seconded by Mr. Frankenfield. The meeting adjourned at 11:45 A.M.
