

MINUTES

June 1, 1972

The meeting of the Hilltown Township Board of Supervisors was held this June 1, 1972, at the Township Building, located on Route 113 and Diamond St., Silverdale, Pa.

The meeting was called to order at 7:30 p.m., by the Chairman, Mr. Frankenfield, with all Supervisors present.

The meeting opened with the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting held May 20, 1972. A motion was made by Mr. Hartshorne to accept the minutes as read, the motion seconded by Mr. Frankenfield.

The bills were reviewed and ordered paid on a motion by Mr. Hartshorne, motion seconded by Mr. Frankenfield.

Present were: Chief Goose, Mr. Gubelman, Mr. Heidrich, Mr. & Mrs. Wagner, Mr. & Mrs. Finklestein, Mr. Angstadt, Jr., Mr. Robinson, Mr. Crawford, Mr. Lacey, Mr. Seljan, Mr. McDonald, Mr. Carter, Mr. Moyer, Mr. Weikel, Mr. & Mrs. Roscoe Moyer, Mr. Ehlinger, Mr. Mininger, Mr. Ziegler, Mr. Ketterer. Reporters were: Florence Schaffhausen, of the Intelligencer; Mr. Cressman, of the Call-Chronicle; Mr. Mitchell, of the North Penn Reporter.

The Supervisors signed the application for County Aid Grant, from the liquid fuels fund tax. We are to receive the amount of \$2,088.04. Receipts from H. A. Berkheimer, Wage Tax, \$9,870.42; and from Titus G. Moyer, Real Estate Tax, \$2,085.50.

Bids were opened for the construction of a bridge across Mill Creek, located on Reliance Rd. The bids were submitted by the following:

On a motion by Mr. Hartshorne, the contract was awarded to Bi-State Construction Co., as the apparent low bidder; the motion was seconded by Mr. Frankenfield, motion unanimous.

The Supervisors are at the present time studying a swimming pool ordinance.

Mr. Finklestein stated that he was requesting the Supervisors to take a position to have the P. P. & L. Electric Line 66KV placed underground. Mr. & Mrs. Roscoe Moyer, Mr. Ketterer, Mr. Weikel, Mr. J. Moyer, Mr. Ziegler support Mr. Finkelstein's request. The Supervisors will give this request further consideration.

Mr. Angstadt, attorney for Mr. & Mrs. Herman Wagner, who requested the Supervisors approval to have the bridge across Morris Run, located on Old Bethlehem Road, L.R. 09088, transferred to them, stated they are willing to assume all costs for the transfer, maintenance and care. Mr. Wagner stated that there would be a cost of \$750 a year to maintain. The Supervisors are willing to consider a proposal of how they will maintain the bridge.

Mr. Carter, a resident of Broad St., stated that he would like to see the Supervisors take the lead in Solid Waste Recycling. He also took issue with our zoning ordinance and did not think it was being enforced. The Supervisor's attorney differed with his opinion.

The P. P. & L. Co. has filed eminent domain proceedings with the Public Utility Commission, Harrisburg, Pa. The persons notified were Arthur & Maria Ketterer, H. Calvin & Doris Weikel, Wilmer and Romaine Ziegler, Justus and Mary Moyer, Herman & Elizabeth Finkelstein, A. Roscoe and Nina F. Moyer.

The Supervisors purchased two \$25,000 bonds with idle funds.
