The meeting of the Hilltown Township Supervisors was held this 4th day of May, at the Township Suilding, located on Route 113 and Diamond St., Silverdale, Pa.

The meeting was called to order by the Chairman, Mr. Frankenfield, at 7:30 P.M., with all Supervisors present. The meeting opened with the reading of the minutes of April 15, 1972. A motion by Mr. Hartshorne was made to accept the minutes as read, with a request to delete the information from Mr. Stewart, and the news release of Mr. Borchers. The secretary agreed, and the motion was then seconded by Mr. Frankenfield.

The bills were reviewed and ordered paid on a motion by Mr. Hartshorne, which was seconded by Mr. Frankenfield.

Present were Mr. Gubelman, Mr. Heidrich, Mr. Browning, Chief Boose, Mr. Haring, Mr. Steinman, Mr. Carter, Mr. Lentz, Mr. Foster, Mr. Ahrens, Mr. Tague, Mr. Al Crawford, Mr. W. Crawford, Mr. Frederick, Mr. Finklestein, Fire Chief Walters, and reporters, Lorraine Campbell, Intelligencer, Mr. Cressman, Call - Chronicle, Mr. Müchell, North Penn Reporter.

Mr. Hartshorne corrected the statement he made at a previous meeting that the new shopping center had a low fire rating. The information he had received was referring to the Shopping Center on Route 309.

The secretary met with Mr. Carson, Director of Natural Resources, and was informed that they will make the study in reference to a Flood Plain. It will be eighteen months before they will be able to make this study.

Correspondence was read. In reference to a request from Engineering News on the project status of a sewer plant, we are still planning.

The Supervisors were notified by our Solicitor, that the various complaints against Bucks County and its municipalities, by the Legal Aid Society, has been dismissed by the Bucks County Court of Common Pleas; also, Mr. Charles Mager's second plea for a Superseades versus Hilltown Township, has been denied.

The Bucks County Water & Sewer Authority invited the Supervisors, Planning Commision, our Solicitor and Engineer, to a meeting to be held in the Community Room of the Courthouse, May 11, 1972, at 8:00 P.M.

The Supervisors approved the request of Mr. Brittan, manager of Hatfield Township, that if we would assume the cost of maintaining the traffic light at Line Lexington, they would assume the cost of maintaining the traffic light at Unionville Pike and Route 309, if the Hatfield Township Commissioners approve.

The semi-annual road inspection was held. The Supervisors found the roads in good condition. We commend our Roadmaster for their good care.

Mr. Heidrich asked for a report on the private meeting held by the Planning Commission, with the Supervisors present and the representatives of the P. P. & L. Co. Mr. Hartshorne stated there was nothing new.

Minutes, May 4, 1972, Page 2:

The Supervisors approved and signed subdivision plans for Stephen Lents, 3 lots, Broad St.; Elmer Hockman, 1 lot, W. Creamery Rd.; Niblock tract, 2 lots, Highland Park Rd.,; Wimmer and Cassel, 3 lots, Schoolhouse Rd. and Keystone Drive.

The Supervisors received one bid for the construction of a bridge and road improvement across Mill Creek, located on Reliance Road, in the amount of \$54,278.80. The bidder was Tobias Construction Co., Yardley, Pa. The Supervisors are taking the bid under advisement and will confer with our engineer.

Mr. Crawford, a resident, stated that as a taxpayer, he resented the township spending money to stop Mr. Horn from quarrying. The Supervisors are trying to enforce the zoning ordinance.

Mr. Ahrens presented the Board with a demographic study of the Centenial Ridge Development, and stated they have reached a tentative agreement with Mr. Lederach for drainage across his property.

Mr. Carter complained about junk cars and meterials used for recycling on his neighbor's property and suggested we take legal action.

Mr. Frederick, a resident of Orchard Road, stated he would like to add his protest against the erection of the P. P. & L. Co. K.V. Line through this area. Mr. Finklestein asked the Supervisors support that the Pennsylvania Power and Light Company place the K.V. power line underground.

Mr. Haring remarked that there were K.V. lines underground in the state of Massachusetts. Mr. Steinman, a resident of East Rock-hill Township, stated that 250 residents of his township had signed a petition against the P. P. & L. Co. line through his township.

The Chairman entertained a motion to adjourn, ammotion was made by Mr. Hartshorns to adjourn, and seconded by Mr. Frankenfield. The meeting adjourned at 10:00 P.M. o'clock.
