MOTION BY MR HARTSHORNE TO ACCEPT MINUTES AS READ, MOTION SECONDED BY MR FRANKENFIELD. MOTION TO PAY ALL BILLS, BY MR. HARTSHORNE, MOTION SECONDED BY MR. FRANKENFIELD.

SUPERVISORS , ENACTED ORDINANCE 72 - I .BE. IT RESOLVED, BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF HILLTOWN TOWNSHIP, AN ORDINANCE REQUIRING THE AFFIXING AND MAINTAINING HOUSE NUMBERS, SERVED BY THE HATFIELD POST OFFICE IN HILLTOWN TOWNSHIP . SO RESOVED THIS 25 TH DAY OF MARCH 1972.

NO ONE WOULD BE FORCED TO CONNECT WITH THE WATER LINE , UNLESS THET DESIRED TO DO SO. AND ONLY THEN WOULD THE FRONT FOOT ASSESSMENT BE REQUIRED.

RECEIVED FROM THE COMMONWEALTH OF PENNSYLVANIA LIQUOR CONTROL BOARD \$1400. FOR LIQUOR LICENSE ISSUED IN HILLTOWN TOWNSHIP.
