BUSH BUILDERS HEARING

SPECICAL MEETING HELD THIS DECEMBER2, 1971 AT THE TOWNSHIP BUILDING, BY THE SUPERVISORS OF HILLTOWN TOWNSHIP. ROUTE 1138 DIAMOND STREET, SILVERDALE, PA PETITOON OF JOSEPH P. BUSH TO REZONE FROM C-N COMMERCIAL, A CERTAIN TRACT OF LAND, SITUATE ON THE SOUTHERLY SODE OF HILLTOWN PIKE, HILLTOWN, PA. BOUNDED ON THE EAST BY THE LANDS OF JAMES CAHILL AND HAVING FRONTAGE OF APPROMMATELRY 971 FEET . THE REQUEST IS TO REZONE THE C-N THE GROUNDS TO A DEPTH OF 400 FT, FROM THE HILLTOWN PIKE WITH THE FRONTAGE OF 971 FEET TO C-S SHOPPING CENTER. THE PETITION FURTHER REQUESTS THAT THE BALANCEOF THE GROUND, LOCATED SOUTH C-N NEIGHHOOD COMMERCIAL SHOPPING DISTRICT BE REZONED TO M - F RESIDENTIAL DISTRICT. THE ENTIRE PARCEL CONTAINS 13.58 ACRES, WITH EACH REQUEST INVOLVING 6%ACRES.

MR. FRANKENFIELD CALLED THE MEETING TO DRSER AT 7 O'CLOCK P.M. SUPERVISORS PRESENT WERE MR. FRANKENFIELD & MR. MOYER. MR. HOCKMAN BEING ABSENT. MR. FRANK-ENFIELD THEN TURNED THE MEETING OVER TO MR . WOLSON OUR SOLICITOR , WHO THEN CONDUCTED THE MEETING.

MR. WILSON ATATED THAT MR. JOSEPH J. BUSH ASKED THE SUPERVISORS , TO REZONE 6 1/2 ACRES FROM C-8 TO H-C AND 6 1/2 ACRES FROM R-2 TO M-F MULTI FAMILY. MR WILSON READ

THE COSTS OF THE BUILDINGS TO BE ATOUND \$20,000 DOLLARS SO AS TO INSTILL PRIDE OF DWNERSHIP. THE COMMERCIAL TOXINXXXXXXXX AREA TO BE SOLD AS A CONDIMINUIM ALSO. GROUND TO REMAIN THE PROPERTY OF THE DEVELOPER. SURFACE WATER TO BE HELD IN IMPOUNDING BASIN 70 FEETX I5X IO, INLET GRATE OF 50 FEETX & FEET WHERE IT WOULD DRAIN AWAY NATURALLY, AND MAINTENANCE WOULD BE TAKEN CARE BY THE CORPORATION. BUILDINGS TO BE SOLD ON A MORTGAGE BASIS. THIS IS WHAT THEY WOULD LIKE TO ACCOMPLISH.

MR. WHITE . HOW FAR IS THE ROAD FROM THE PAROCHIAL SCHOOL.

MRS GANNON. STATED THAT NO ONE WOULD WANT OT BE COOPED ALL DAY IN AN APARTMENT. QUESTION WAS AKED HOW MUCH WERE THESE APARTMENTS TO RENT FOR, ANSWER WAS \$155.00 A MONTH. I SEDROOM.

MR. GRUES. COULD THEY ADD MORE BUILDINGS, MR WILSON, DNLY BY A ZONING VARIANCE.

QUESTION. IS THERE ADEQUATE WATER SUBPLY, MR BUSH STATED THERE WAS MR. MARX ALSO STATED THERE WAS ADEQUATE SUPPLY.

MR. DRMOND. WHO IS RESPONSIB BLE IF MY WELL GOES DRY.

MR. BUSH. WE WOULD HAVE AN AUXIALLARY WATER SUPPLY FROM THE NORTH PENN WATER

MR. PURCELL. DID NOT THINK WE NEEDE A SHOPPINF CENTER, OR A GAS STATION. MRS CAMBURN. WANTED A DIRECT ANSWER TO THE WELL. MR BUSH . WE WILL HAVE AN AUX-IALLARY LINE.

MR. CRAWFORD . WHO IS GOING TO BUILD THE SEWER & WATER LIDES. MR. BUSH WOULD. MR. HARTSHORNE. WANTED A SHOW OF HANDS, HOW MANY WOULD WANT IT.

MR. BUSH . THIS WOULD BE UNFAIR.

JAMES CAHILL. STATED THAT THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, WERE PRESENTED WITHK A PETITION WITH 300 HUNDRED SIGNATURES. AND HOW LONG THE SEWER WOULD REMAIN PRIVATE A QUESTION ABOUT THE WATER TABLE. MR BUSH . STATED THAT THIS SURFACE WATER DID NO. NOT GO DOWN TO THE WATER TABLE.

MR. SCHADLER DID NOT THINK THE PEOPLE WANTED THIS AREA REZONED.

MR. THOMAS, STATED THAT EVERY ONE IN THIS AREA SHOULD BE CONCERNED ABOUT THE DRIV THE SIZE. AS IT WOULD TAKE AWAY THE WATER.

MR. BARCLAY. WHICH WAY WILL THE SEWER LINE RUN. IT WOULD RUN DOWN HI LTOWN PIKE.

MR. MARX. STATED THAT PEOPLE WOULFD RUN OUT OF WATER ANYWAY, AND THAT HE WANTED TO SELL THE GROUND. AND AT ONE TIME HE WANTED TO PUT 14 HOMES ON THE GROUND AND NO ONE WANTED TO BUY

MR. HARTSHORNE PLANNING COMMISSION MEMBER, STATED THAT IT WAS THE 5 MEMBER PLANNING COMMISSION DECISION THET THE REZONING BE REJECTED, AND THAT THE APPLICATION WAS LUD

ICROUS.

MR. WHITE. STATED THAT THREE HUNDRED SIGNATURES WERE DROUGHT INTO THE SUPERVISORS, AND THEY DID NOT WANT THE APARTMENTS.

DON MITCHELL. NORTH PENN REPORTER, ASKED IF THE ELECTRIC WIRING WOULD BE UNDERGROUND MR. KELLER. WANTED TO KNOW IF THERE WERE SET BACK LINE FROM THE CENTER OF THE ROAD.

MRS CAMBURN. STATED THAT THIS SHOULD REMAIN RESIDENTIAL AND REMAIN RURAL.
MR. ROCHLISS. STATED THAT THEY COULD STILL BUILD STORES.
MR. TIMLIN. STATED THAT HE DID NOT WANT TO LIVE IN APARTMENTS, AND WAS NOT IN FAVOR OF THIS DEVELOPMENT.

MR. ORMOND . WANTED TO KNOW IS THERE WAS A GRADING PLAN. MR. BUSH . ENGINEERS HAVE GONE INTO RATHER THORIUGHLY.

MR. GAHILL. STATED THAT THE JACKSON REALTY CO , HAVE APPROCHED PEOPLE TO PURCHASE THEIR PROPERTY . ALSO IF THIS WOULD BE PRIMARY OR SECONDARY ELECTRIC SERVIGE, AND IF IT WOULD REQUIRE POLE TYPE LIGHTING.

MR. PURCELL. HOW LONG BEFORE A DECISION IS REACHED.

MR. WILSON. MAYBE TWO WEEKS OR TWO DAYS. OR LONGER.
MR. ANTUNNES . CHAIRMAN OF THE ZONNING COMMITTE IN 1958& 8959. THIS COMMERCIAL WAS
ONLY INTENDED FOR THE STORE, HOTEL AND THE HENDRICKS COAL AND CIL.

MRS . ROSSINS WOULD A TRAFFIC LIGHT BE NEEDED.

MR. MARTINDALE. WOULD LIKE THE SUPERVISORS TO LEAVE THE AREA AS IS.

MR. KELLER. DULD MORE APARTMENTS COME IN.

MRS DOUGHERTY. WOULD THIS BE MR. BUSH SEWER LINE.

MR SUSH. STATED THAT A PACKAGE PLANT WOULD COST \$125,000.00 DOLLARS. AND BEFORE MORE APARTMENTS COULD BE PLACED ON THIS GROUND, IT WOULD HAVE TO COME BEFORE A ZONING VARIANCE HEARING SDARD.

THIS SEING THE END OF TESTIMONY AND OPPOSITION TO THE PROPOSED REZONING .
