

MEETING OF THE HILLTOWN TOWNSHIP SUPERVISORS, WAS HELD THIS 18 TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER 1971. AT THE TOWNSHIP BUILDING , LOCATED ON ROUTE 113 & DIAMOND STREET. SILVERDALE, PA 18962.

MEETING CALLED TO ORDER BY THE CHAIRMAN MR HOCKMAN. AT 9 O'CLOCK A.M. WITH THE REQUEST THE SECRETARY READ THE MINUTES OF THE MEETING HELD SEPTEMBER 4, 1971.

CHAIRMAN ENTERTAINED A MOTION TO ACCEPT MINUTES AS READ. MOTION BY MR. FRANKENFIELD TO ACCEPT MINUTES AS READ. MOTION SECONDED BY MR HOCKMAN. MOTION BY FRANKENFIELD TO PAY ALL BILLS . MOTION SECONDED BY MR. HOCKMAN.

VISITORS PRESENT WERE MR. BROWNING, MR ESCHELMAN, MR. GUSELMAN, MR. LINSLEY, MR& MRS PARKER. REPORTERS LORRAINE CAMPBELL INTELLINGENDER, MR. MITCHELL NORTH PENN, MR. CRESSMAN ALLENTOWN MORNING CALL.

RECEIVED FROM TITUS G. MOYER TAX COLLECTOR, REAL ESTATE TAX OF REAL ESTATE \$536.92 AND PER CAPITA TAX \$8,428.00 ATOTAL OF \$8,964.92.

MR ESCHELMAN REQUESTED THE SUPERVISORS TO CHANGE OUR ZONING ORDINANCE ALLOWING SHELTERS FOR SCHOOL CHILDREN . HE WAS INFORMED THE WERE ALLOWED IF THE CONFORMED WITH OUR ZONING ORDINANCE.

MR JOHN CARSON JR. GAVE THE SUPERVISORS, DIRECTOR OF THE NATURAL RESOURCES , GAVE US A BRIEFING WHAT THE COUNTY EXPECTS TO DO CONCERNING THE DAM SITE 625 IS TO BE CONSTRUCTED.

ALL PROPERTY IS NOW OWNED BY THE NESHAMINY WATER RESOURCES DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY. THESE PROPERTIES ARE TO BE ADVERTISED FOR SALE WITHIN 2 YEARS AFTER ACQUISITION WITH THE EASEMENT RESTRICTIONS. BY SEALED BIDS.

DAM SITE 625 IS DESIGNED TO HOLD BACK WATER FROM A STORM WITH 25 INCHES OF RAIN IN A 6 HOUR PERIOD.

PERMANENT EASEMENT RESTRICTIONS , IN THE BROWN FLOOD AREA, AND COUNTY HAS RIGHT TO FLOOD THE LAND WITHOUT RIGHT FOR DAMAGES.

RED AND GREEN OUTER LIMITS ONLY 15% OF THE LAND MAY BE USED FOR BLDG PURPOSES, AND AGRICULTURE USE MUST BEAS TO THE RULES OF THE SUCKS COUNTY CONSERVATION REGULATIONS.

CONSTRUCTION TO START BY 1974. AND THAT THE BRIDGE ON CHURCH ROAD WOULD BE RAISED AND THE ROAD WOULD REMAIN OPEN, THIS HE STATED WOULD RAISE THE COST OF THE DAM ABOUT \$100,000. DOLLARS.

MR CARSON STATED THAT 125 ACRES COULD BE USED FOR DEVELOPMENTS, HE ALSO WANTED TO KNOW IF A DEVELOPER PURCHASE THIS ACREAGE, WOULD THE SUPERVISOR ALLOW A DEVELOPER TO BRING IN SEWER. AND IF THEY COULD SO ADVERTISE. AS THIS IS NEAR THE HATFIELD TOWNSHIP SEWER AUTHORITY.

A MOTION BY MR. HOCKMAN , THAT HILLTOWN TOWNSHIP SUPERVISORS , WILL ALLOW , HATFIELD SEWER AUTHORITY, BE ALLOWED TO SEWER THIS AREA IF A DEVELOPER SO DESIRES, WITHOUT FINANCIAL OBLIGATION TO THE TOWNSHIP. THIS MOTION SECONDED BY MR. FRANKENFIELD. MOTION UNANIMOUS.

HILLTOWN TOWNSHIP COULD CREATE AN AUTHORITY, OR DESIGNATE THE SUCKS COUNTY WATER AND SEWER AUTHORITY TO ENTER INTO AGREEMENTS WITH THE HATFIELD SEWER AUTHORITY, AND HAVE AGREEMENTS , THAT HILLTOWN TOWNSHIP WOULD BE PROTECTED.

DEVELOPER MAY PUT IN SEWER LINES, BUT ACCORDING TO HILLTOWN TOWNSHIP SPECIFICATIONS, ALSO TO HAVE AN AGREEMENT AFTER BEING COMPLETED, AND THEN BE DEDICATED TO THE TOWNSHIP.

THE TOWNSHIP WOULD THEN BILL THE SEWER RENTALS TO ITS CUSTOMERS, THEN PAY THE HATFIELD SEWER AUTHORITY FOR SEWAGE TREATMENT.

MR. LEONARD LINSLEY , ASKED THE SUPERVISORS THEIR REASONS FOR PROHIBITING GUN CLUBS, THEIR REASONS WERE THAT THE CITIZENS IN THE AREAS COMPLAINED OF THE NOISE AND DANGER. SUPERVISORS DID NOT THINK THAT A VARIANCE WOULD BE GRANTED.

WE HAVE BEEN REQUESTED BY CITIZENS WHOSE RESIDENCES ARE ON DIAMOND ST BETWEEN RICKERT ROAD AND MILL ROAD , OF A DANGEROUS CURVE, AND IF IT COULD BE STRAIGHTENED, AS IT HAS BEEN THE SCENE OF NUMEROUS ACCIDENTS.

CITIZENS OF HILLTOWN TOWNSHIP HAVE BEEN CALLING ATTENTION OF THE SUPERVISORS OF HAZARDOUS CONDITION AT ROUTE 152 AND RICKERT ROAD, ALSO AT ROUTE 113 AND CALLOWHILL ROAD.

MR. GEORGE E DRESSING, RECEIVED FINAL APPROVAL , PRIVALTELY SUPERVISED DISPLAY OF NAVAL AIRCRAFT. FOR CHURCH GROUPS, SCHOOL CHILDREN AND SCOUTS.

MRS EDWARDS, A RESIDENT OF MILL ROAD IF SIGNS COULD BE ERCTED AT CHURCH ROAD AND KEYSTONE DRIVE, FOR THE SAFETY OF THE SCHOOL CHILDREN . THEIR BEING NO FURTHER BUSINESS, A MOTION BY MR. HOCKMAN TO ADJOURN.
