

HILLTOWN TOWNSHIP SUPERVISORS, MET THIS APRIL 17, 1971. AT THE TOWNSHIP BUILDING, LOCATED ON ROUTE 113, SILVERDALE, PA.

SUPERVISORS WERE ALL PRESENT MR, HOCKMAN, CALLED MEETING TO ORDER AT 9.0'CLOCK A.M. WITH READING OF THE MINUTES OF THE APRIL 7, 1971 . MEETING.

MOTION BY MR. FRANKENFIELD TO ACCEPT MINUTES AS READ. MOTION WAS SECONDED BY MR HOCKMAN.

MOTION BY MR. FRANKENFIELD TO PAY ALL BILLS. MOTION SECONDED BY MR. HOCKMAN. MOTION UNANIMOUS.

VISITORS PRESENT WERE, MR. TIMLIN, MR. WHITE, MR. HELHOWSKI, MR. BROWNING, MR. HEIDRICH, LOUISE RECKNER, MR. & MRS ORMOND, MR. MRS GANNON, MR. & MRS MARX, MRS ROBBINS, MR. SCHAIDLING, MR . MURPHY, MR. WENTZ, MR. STILES, MR. LEDERACH, MR, GUBELMAN, MR. MOHR, MR. MININGER, MR. GARTNER, MR. KELLER, MRS SMITH, MR. & MRS BADMAN, MR. CRESSMAN NEWS HERALD- MORNING CALL REPORTER, MR MILLER QUAKERTOWN FREE PRESS REPORTER.

MR. KELLER ASKED IF THE SUPERVISORS , HAD AN AGENDA. THE ORDER OF BUSINESS , READING OF THE MINUTES, AND PAYING OF BILLS , THEN CONSIDER THE REQUEST OF THE CITIZENS PRESENT, AND OTHER BUSINESS BROUGHT BEFORE THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS. MR KELLER REQUESTED FINANCIAL STATEMENT BE READ, MR KELLER SUGGESTED THAT ONE OF THE SUPERVISORS SHOULD ATTEND EACH ZONING HEARING BOARD HEARING, MR. HOCKMAN THAT OUR ATTORNEY ATTENDED EACH MEETING AND SUPERVISORS WERE NOT REQUIRED TO ATTEND.

MR. BROWNING REQUESTED THE READING & BREAKDOWN OF THE ENGINEERING FEE'S. MR. WHITE , OF BROAD STREET , PRESENTED THE SUPERVISORS WITH 300 SIGNATURES OF RESIDENTS IN THE HILLTOWN AREA, AGAINST THE REZONING OF A CERTAIN AREA FROM R- 50 TO M.F. MULTI FAMILY. THIS ZONING CHANGE WOULD HAVE TO HAVE A PUBLIC HEARING.

MRS ROBBINS , WANTED TO KNOW WHERE THE SEWER LINES ARE TO BE, THE PRESENT TALK IS THAT IT WOULD HAVE TO COME FROM THE NEW- BRIMAIN- CHALFONT SEWER AUTHORITY OR THE HATFIELD AUTHORITY.

MR. MARX STATED THAT HE WAS ASSESSED WITH AN OCCUPATION TAX AND ONLY LIVED HERE NINE MONTH, HE WAS INFORMED HE WOULD HAVE TO DISCUSS THIS WITH THE TAX COLLECTOR.

MR. GARTNER, REMARKED TO THE SUPERVISORS, THAT THERE SHOULD BE A FOUR WAY STOP SIGN AT CALLOWHILL ROAD & RICKERT ROAD. ALSO AT HILLTOWN PIKE & GREEN STREET.

A LETTER FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION, THEY WOULD CONDUCT A SURVEY FOR A REDUCED SPEED LIMIT ON L.R. (919) .

WERE NOTIFIED BY THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, THAT THERE WAS A POSSIBILITY THAT THE HIDDEN VALLEY LANDFILL MIGHT BE CLOSED.
