January 23, 1971

The Hilltown Township Supervisors met this Saturday, January 23, 1971, at the Township Building, Route 113 and Diamond St., Silverdale, Pa. The meeting called to order by the Chairman, Mr. Hockman, with the requesting of the reading of the minutes of January 9, 1971.

On a motion by Mr. Frankenfield, it was requested that the minutes be accepted as read; the motion was seconded by Mr. Hockman.

Mr. Frankenfield made a motion that all bills be paid, this also seconded by Mr. Hockman.

Our visitors were Mr. Dalton, Mr. Cressman, reporters for the Intelligencer and News-Herald and Morning Call reapectively. Mr. Gubelman and Mr. Heidrich, township residents, were also present.

The Supervisors signed the preliminary plans for Byron Effrig, two lots, 3.701 acres, located on Route 313.

There was some discussion on the cost of a variance. The Supervisors agreed to leave the cost remain at \$75 for the year 1971.

The Supervisors received from the Board of Assessment, a request to notify John L. Brinton, Harrisburg, the assessed amount of the public utility in Hilltown Township, and the tax amount.

We reviewed the police report.

A news letter from the Delaware River Basin Water Resources Assoc. invites us to a meeting to be held at the Mohonk Mountain Hguse, New Paltz, N.Y.

The Sellersville Fire Dept. reports for the year of 1970 that they covered five fires for Hilltown, with an estimated value of \$17,000, and a loss of \$15,000.

There was some discussion of sewer needs, by the Supervisors, in reference to the meeting attended with a group of interested business men, who explored the idea of the possibility of sewers along the 309 area. The Supervisors have no objection.

Mr. Paul W. Meyers requested in a letter, for information for ~~XXXXXXXXXX~~ building permits, sewage disposal and other regulations. The Secretary is to refer him to our zoning officer.

There being no further business, on a motion by Mr. Hockman, and seconded by Mr. Frankenfield, the meeting adjourned at 11:15 A.M.
