The Semi-Monthly Meeting of the Hilltown Township Board of Supervisors was held this day with all members present. Mr. Frankfield, Presiding. The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved. Bills amounting \$1835.12 from the General Fund were approved for payment. The Budget which had been advertised for a month & was available for inspection at the Township office for the month of Feb. was presented for adoption. The Resolution was read by the Secretary which showed an increase of .001 Mill to make a total of 1.005 (Five) mills for the current year's taxes. The Budget showed Receipts & Cash Balance from prior years to be \$104,665.80 and expenditures for the current year to be \$104,665.80. A motion by Mr. Hickman, seconded - Mr. Agin to adopt said Budget, motion carried. The bids for stone were opened, with the following results:

There being no question on these two bids, Loder & Sharp was then awarded said contract for 1962 at .17 1/2 gal. Mr. Cowen, the Township Engineer was present to present his plans for the bridge on Eckerts Road. After study of these plans, the Board instructed Mr. Cowen to make new drawings & present them at the next meeting. Mr. Agin, reported that the Dept of Labor & Industry, Social Security Dept, wanted records made available to their auditor for the years from 1951 to 1961. The secretary is to make these records available as soon as possible. There being no further business, meeting adjourned to meet April 7 - 1962, 9:00 AM. at the Township office.
