A Message from your Zoning Officer

When are Permits Required?

When planning a project in your home or business, it is always a good idea to ask the building official if a permit is required, and what to expect of the permitting process. Any property owner who intends to build, alter, enlarge, or replace a portion of their building, will need a building and/or zoning permit. This all includes mechanical, electrical, plumbing, fire alarm, and fire suppression systems.

All permit applications can be found on Hilltown.org. The forms include submission instructions but we always welcome inquiries. Below are lists of work that require permits for which we commonly receive applications and inquiries. Plenty of other work not listed below may require permits, so please always contact the office if you are unsure if your project will require one!

- Zoning Permit: New construction and Additions, Patios and Decks, Sheds, Accessory Family Residence, Chicken Coops, Signs, Fences, Home Occupations.
- Building Permit: Re-roof, Demolition, Decks 30" above grade, Alterations, Additions, and New Construction, New, replacement or alteration to mechanical, electrical, and plumbing systems, Residential garages and sheds greater than 1000 sq. ft.

Permits are not required for residential replacement of doors, windows, and vinyl siding. Please feel free to call our office with any lingering questions regarding your personal or commercial projects!

A Message from your Public Works Director

Our objective for Hilltown Township Public Works Department is to enhance the quality of life for our residents by providing efficient, effective, and sustainable services in infrastructure maintenance, environmental stewardship, and community services. We are committed to ensuring safe and reliable roadways, water systems, and public spaces, while promoting responsible resource management and fostering a resilient and thriving community.

2025 summer projects consist of Asphalt seal coating projects on Upper Church Road and Rickert Road along with numerous paving projects. We also have scheduled box culvert and pipe replacement projects throughout the township. There will be road closures for these projects and they will be posted on the Township Website.

We will be maintaining and upgrading our open spaces and parks throughout the upcoming months. Last Fall we planted a perennial wild flower mix in one of our open spaces, and are looking forwarding to seeing it bloom! If our plan mix is successful, we hope to plant it at other locations throughout the Township. We will continue to plant of variety of shade trees throughout our parks and open spaces this season as well. Also, a half mile connector for our Fairhill walking path will be completed this summer!

The Penn Oak Tree: A Local Historic Landmark Courtesy of the Hilltown Historic Society

Around the 1680s, an acorn sprouted into an oak tree in an area known now as Hilltown Township. This occurred about 200 feet from an ancient Lenape trail. The speed limit on this Native American trail is now 45 mph. We call it Hilltown Pike. An oak tree dating back to the days of William Penn is identified as a Penn Oak. The side street of Chalfont Road connects Hilltown Pike to the Penn Oak. In May of 1683, William Penn left Philadelphia to negotiate a land treaty with some Lenape Chiefs in an area in the vicinity of the current Philadelphia Glider Council on Route 152 in Hilltown Township.

This newly sprouting oak was on the site of the original Hilltown Baptist Church, built in 1737 on land donated by pioneer Welsh Reverend William Thomas. In time, two more churches were built on this site until finally, in 1970, the Lower Hilltown Baptist Church was demolished. Services continue to this day at the Upper Hilltown Baptist Church in the old "Nace's Corner". The cemetery at the Lower Church site remains and is carefully tended to by the Hilltown Baptist Church. Burials date back to the 1700s. Some unmarked graves are said to be for Native Americans. Veterans of the Revolutionary War are also buried here.

The tree was a hardy specimen, until storms damaged the heavy branches in recent years. Finally, its long life ended. It has been cut down, providing tons of firewood. Some people felt that this was the last of Bucks County Penn Oak Trees. It also was a tree that was within yards of William Penn's journey in Hilltown. Might a fallen acorn from this behemoth extend its legacy, just as our children and grandchildren extend ours? If so, this tree does have a future.



- Finish your day of adventure with a well deserved treat from Sunday School.


A Day Back to Historic Hilltown:

Rain washes pollutants into storm drains which flows directly into our streams, lakes, rivers and the ocean. So what can you do?

WHAT'S THE PROBLEM WITH WASHING YOUR CAR?

Washing your car on a paved surface can allow the soapy wash water and other pollutants, like oil and grease, to run off into a storm drain. Most soap contains phosphates and other chemicals that, in large amounts can contaminate your drinking water, as well as kill fish, wildlife and plants. The soap, together with the dirt and oil washed from your car, flows into nearby storm drains, which flows directly into lakes, rivers and the ocean. The phosphates from the soap can cause excess algae to grow, which can be harmful to the water quality.

YOU CAN HELP!

- Take your car to a car washing facility, rather than washing it yourself. Commercial car washes treat and recycle the water.
- If you can't get to a car washing facility, wash your car on an unpaved surface and use biodegradable soap.
- Organize a Car Wash Fundraiser for a local organization.

WHY SHOULD YOU CARE ABOUT CLEAN WATER?

Stormwater pollution is one of the greatest threats to Pennsylvanias clean water supply. Clean water provides access to safe drinking water, places for recreation, commercial opportunities, healthy wildlife habitats, and adds beauty to our landscape. Rain washes pollution from streets, parking lots, and lawns into storm drains, then directly to our streams, rivers, lakes and oceans.

Did you know more than 60 percent of water pollution comes from things like motor oil, fertilizers, pet waste, and detergents? By sharing the responsibility and making small, easy changes in our daily lives, we can keep common pollutants out of stormwater.





What Is Grasscycling

Grasscycling is the simple practice of leaving grass clippings on the lawn when mowing. Once cut, grass clippings first dehydrate, then decompose, quickly disappearing from view.

Grasscycling —

Encourages a healthier lawn by returning nutrients to the soil beneath the lawn.

Reduces work because you don't have to bag or rake and dispose of your clippings.

Saves you money because you don't have to pay for disposal of your clippings.

Benefits the environment by naturally recycling the clippings.

Simply put, grasscycling is good for your lawn and can help you reduce waste. Learn how easy it is for you to begin grasscycling.

How To Begin

Proper mowing is required for successful grasscycling. Cut grass when the surface is dry, and keep mower blades sharp. Follow the "1/3 Rule": mow your lawn often enough so that no more than 1/3 of the length of the grass blade is cut in any one mowing. Frequent mowing will produce short clippings that will not cover up the grass surface. You may have to cut the lawn every 7 days when the lawn is growing fast but only every 7 to 14 days when the lawn is growing slowly.

You can grasscycle with most any mower (push, electric or gas). The mower collection bag should be removed to allow clippings to drop on the lawn. However, if your mower does not have a safety flap covering the opening where the bag fits into the chute, it is important that you purchase a retrofit kit from your local retailer.

Most lawnmower manufacturers have developed "mulching" mowers which cut grass blades into small pieces and force them into the soil. These types of mowers are effective in grasscycling and have become very popular. They are sold at many yard and garden equipment retailers, nurseries, and home supply stores.

Common Grasscycling Questions

Does grasscycling cause thatch?

No! Research has shown that grass roots are the primary cause of thatch, not grass clippings. Thatch is composed primarily of roots, stems, rhizomes, and other plant materials. These plant materials contain large amounts of lignin (fibrous material) and decompose slowly. Grass clippings are approximately 80-85 percent water with only small amounts of lignin, and decompose rapidly.

Does grasscycling spread lawn disease?

No. Improper watering and fertilizing are the primary cause of disease spread. If an accommodating environment for turfgrass disease is present, infestation will occur whether clippings are collected or not.Will grasscycling make my lawn look bad?

No! If a lawn is properly mowed, watered, and fertilized, grasscycling can actually produce a healthier looking lawn. It is important to cut the lawn frequently to produce small clippings that will decompose quickly. If a lawn is not cut frequently and clippings are left on the lawn, it will produce a "hay-like" look which can be unsightly.

Are there alternatives to grasscycling?

Yes! Grasscycling does not work in every situation. Prolonged wet weather, mower breakdowns, or infrequent mowing are situations where grass clippings should probably be bagged since a large number of clippings may be generated. But don't throw the clippings away! Add clippings to your compost pile, or use them as mulch around trees, flowerbeds, and shrubs.

Does grasscycling require special equipment?

Refer to your owner's manual or contact a local lawnmower dealer to learn if you can safely grasscycle. You may need to purchase a retrofit kit, and your mower dealer can assist you with selecting the correct one. Mulching mowers make grasscycling easy by cutting grass blades into small pieces and forcing them into the soil. Electric mulching mowers can also help reduce air pollution.
