A Message from your Zoning Officer

What is Hilltown Township's Zoning Hearing Board? When is it Useful?

Imagine that you've done your due diligence by submitting the building and zoning application to the township in anticipation of your envisioned chicken coop. But what happens when the stars don't align with Hilltown Township's Zoning Ordinance and your application is turned down? As it turns out, in order to have chickens, you are required to own 3 full acres (and can own up to 50 fowl)! That's the rule, but let's say your dream is to have 6 chickens and you live on 2 acres. Seems reasonable, right? You can still achieve your goals by going before the Zoning Hearing Board to pave a path to fresh eggs at brunch.

An application for the appeal to the Zoning Hearing Board is available online at our website or in person at our office. Once submitted, the application will result in the scheduling of a zoning hearing before the Hilltown Township Zoning Hearing Board. Often, it's advised to bring a professional along to assist you with your presentation.

The Zoning Hearing Board will decide to approve or disapprove your request following the hearing. Once approved, you will be formally notified, and your project will be one step being completed.



We were able to complete 7 miles of road maintenance by means of inhouse paving and road sealing work. We also repainted centerlines, stop bars and crosswalks throughout the township. The team has completed numerous storm water repairs and improvements. We were able to perform park, open space and roadside shoulder mowing throughout the township.

Hilltown Teacher: Heroine in Fire

This was the headline in the Central News (Perkasie) Newspaper on March 26, 1924. Miss Elizabeth Bowen was the teacher at the Gehman School at the time. This is the school building that stands at the corner of Route 113 and Telegraph Rd. Miss Bowen had 34 students that day, ranging from 1st to 8th grade. Mid-morning she noticed smoke wafting across the adjacent field. At first, she wasn't alarmed, but in time, the amount of smoke increased. She went outside to investigate, only to find flames bursting through the wood shingle roof and cupola that held the school bell.

Miss Bowen returned inside to announce that school was dismissed for the day, and the older children helped the younger ones with their coats and lunch buckets. Once all the students were safely outside and standing in the field across Telegraph Road, she sent some students to the neighboring McCormick home to send the alarm to the Silverdale and Perkasie Fire Companies. The teacher and some of the older boys went back inside the burning building to retrieve what they could. Unfortunately, the fire had spread too much and only a Victrola, a filing cabinet and a few books were saved. Found next to the saved items was a bucket of coal that a boy thought should be saved. The boys also attempted to rescue a piano from inside the school, but by the time they got it to the doors on the porch, the flaming cupola crashed down and they abandoned their effort.

When the Silverdale Fire Department arrived, flames were coming through the roof. A few minutes later, when the Perkasie Department arrived, the entire top of the building was in

flames. The building was deemed a total loss. The fire was caused by a spark from the chimney that ignited the wood shingle roof. For the remainder of the school year, the students met at the Silverdale Fire House for classes. The building was rebuilt in time for the new school year, this time with asbestos shingles.

We are fortunate to benefit from the survival of the building today, The Hickory Stick Ice Cream Store, serving treats to us all.

The Environmental Cost of Lawns

Despite looking lush and green, traditional turf grass lawns provide little to no environmental benefits. In fact, they often have detrimental effects on the quality of local waterways, wildlife habitat, and the air that we breathe. Here are some of the ways that lawns can harm the environment:

- Lack of Biodiversity lawns are typically made up of a single, nonnative grass species that does not provide shelter or food for wildlife.
- **Increased Water Usage** lawns consume more water than native landscapes leading to water waste and increased runoff.
- **Increased Carbon Footprint** the maintenance of lawns requires the use of gas powered lawn equipment that contributes to air pollution and greenhouse gas emissions.
- Use of Harmful Pesticides / Fertilizer these chemicals can harm local wildlife, contaminate water resources, and lead to the growth of algae that can be harmful to humans and pets.

Want to swap your high maintenance lawn for something more colorful, environmentally friendly, and easy to manage? Here are some ways to add biodiversity back into your yard:

- **Decrease your lawn area** smothering grass with cardboard is an easy way to kill turf and add garden area to your yard. Late summer / fall is the perfect time to remove turf and add native plants!
- Reduce / eliminate your household pesticide / herbicide use use environmentally friendly alternatives or eliminate lawn care products all together!
- Plant with a variety of native species native plants are vital to the survival of pollinators, birds and other wildlife. When planting your garden, aim to use species that bloom throughout the year as well as a mix of perennials, shrubs and trees!
- Add a bird, bat or pollinator house providing safe areas for wildlife to rest and raise their young is a great way to increase the diversity of wildlife that call your yard home!






Real estate tax bills are mailed directly to property owners. County/Township tax bills are mailed by March 1st, and School tax bills by July 1st.

If you have a mortgage escrow, you should forward the tax bill to your mortgage lender.

Bills may be paid in person, by mail, through web banking, or online. In-person payments are accepted at the Hilltown Township Building according to the dates specified on your bill and on the website. There is also a 24/7 Drop Box at the Hilltown Township Building.
